SOUTH CAROLINA WING NOTES

SC Wing Enters Phase 1 of COVID-19 Remobilization:

On 23 August, Wing Commander Col Lee Safley announced that South Carolina Wing had been authorized to enter Phase 1 of COVID-19 remobilization plan immediately. CAP remains committed to the safety and well-being of all members. South Carolina Wing is taking measures to keep our members safe as we move toward normal meetings.

As released by the Wing Commander, in-person meetings for mission critical personnel and command personnel may resume, following the prescribed safety measures. Phase 1 and 2 will require temperature checks, the wearing of face masks, gloves and disinfection between meetings. Phase 3 restrictions will be considered as we move nearer to that phase.

Phase I does not include weekend activities, overnight activities or gathering in groups larger than 10 people. Virtual meetings and activities will continue through Phase 3 in conjunction with any in-person meetings.

Phase 1 <10 Low-Risk Member Meetings – THIS IS OUR CURRENT PHASE**Standard**

- Self-Identified low-risk category may return to meetings so long as groups are <10, socially distancing and wearing cloth face coverings, hygiene, health status checks through questions and temperature checks, and public health reminders.
- The metric to transition to Phase 1 is the containment strategy start date from <https://www.covidactnow.org/> after selecting your state.
- Remember that the transition to Phase 1 must be continually reassessed to ensure that the metrics are valid; plan for the Phase 1 transition but be prepared to change as the Phase metrics may change rapidly.
- Aviation – face coverings, aviation gloves and plane disinfection between sorties. Includes flight evaluations/check rides, crew proficiency, dual instruction (assuming all members are low-risk and all flight operations are in low-risk areas).

Strategy

- Essential missions and meetings shall employ full public health protection measures such as: hygiene education, having hand sanitizer available, performing routine hand washing breaks, daily cleaning of individual workspace, wearing of cloth face coverings, social distancing, temperature checks, and asking members if they feel well before entering a meeting/mission.
- Monitoring members health status during meetings or missions through routine no-touch temperature checks and asking if members feel well.
- Place seats 6 feet apart, double-arm-interval distancing, open air meetings, if possible.

Return to Meetings

CAP is committed to ensuring that we take the necessary precautions to make our return to meetings, of any size, as safe as possible for our members. Please read this information, and lets all work together to keep everyone safe. Civil Air Patrol is working within the federal “Opening Up America Plan.” Please understand that situations and plans may change. Even with precautions in place, there is still an inherent risk associated with participation. Attendance is voluntary. You must register before every meeting. If you do not register by the deadline, you will not be able to attend.

Parent Responsibilities

- Parents should check their cadet’s temperature before attending any meetings or activities.
- Parents should notify the designated Cadet Program member if their cadet has an onset of symptoms such as a fever >100.4°, cough, sore throat, loss of taste or smell in the last 72 hours.
- Parents will not register their cadet to attend any meeting or activity if they or any member of their household has had an onset of illness with symptoms consistent with COVID-19 within the previous 14-days.
- Parents will not be admitted to the facility.
- Parents will supply their cadet with **individual-sized hand sanitizer** and **face coverings/masks**.
- Parents will adhere to social distancing requirements outside of their vehicles, or stay in their vehicles.
- Parents should not leave the area, as we may encounter unexpected inclement weather. We will not

be able to social distance if we are forced to move inside.

- Parents must make sure that their cadet brings an adequate supply of water.

Senior Member Responsibilities

- Senior members will not be permitted to enter the facility or outside areas where a meeting is to occur if they or any member of their household has had an onset of illness with symptoms consistent with COVID-19 within the previous 14 days.
- Civil Air Patrol leadership will provide adequate space for any meeting or activity that ensures adequate proper social distancing.
- Senior Members will wear facemasks during meetings and activities.
- Senior Members will organize drop-off and pick-up areas for cadets to minimize social contact.

Cadet Member Responsibilities

- Cadets will adhere to all standards and instructions given by command.
- Cadets should wash their hands before and after any meeting or activity.
- Cadets should not share water, food, equipment, or supplies.
- Cadets must practice proper social distancing and place equipment/supplies 6 ft apart.
- Cadets must refrain from handshakes, high-fives, and any other direct physical contact.

Squadron Responsibilities

- Cleaning according to standards set by Wing/National that are in place for Phase 2.
- Members have temperature checked when arriving. (If elevated, member will be sent home.)
- Maintaining hand sanitizer just in case members forget/lose their supply and we admit them to the building in an emergency.
- Liquid soap available in all bath rooms.
- Disposable paper towels available in all bathrooms.
- Small # of disposable masks available for emergencies.
- Registration for all meetings.

Restrooms will remain closed except for emergencies as there is a need to clean them after every use.

Plan ahead.

Operational Priorities

The following mission priorities, in order of importance, are established for South Carolina Wing for in-person air, ground and UAS operations:

REDCAP Operations (SAR/DR)
COVID-19 Mission Support
A-12 Maintenance per NHQ/CC 21 Apr 20 Memo (until emerging from Phase 0)
A-9 Maintenance
Low Level Route Surveys
Taskings as Directed by NHQ
CAPF 5/91 Requalification
Air Defense Activities (Fertile Keynote)
A-12/B-12 Proficiency

- Individual, one-on-one, dual-flight instruction as may be appropriate for cadet/senior members
- Individual, one-on-one, aircrew training SAREX, Air and Ground Training (UDF/GTM/MO/MS/AP etc....) and Local Monthly Training
- C-8 Meetings
- C-17 Proficiency
- Cadet Orientation
- TOP Program
- ROTC Program
- Other Taskings

Ultimately, the highest priority in South Carolina Wing, outside of REDCAP response, is CAPF 5/91 requalification as over 33% of our resources will expire and not be available for mission response without this prioritization. So, A-12 proficiency or cadet orientation or member instruction can be delayed or postponed as a result. Just because one *can* does not mean one *should*.

With respect to defined Reopening Phases, the following mission types and priorities will be considered under the respective Phases, and all phases require with face masks, aviation gloves and disinfection between sorties:

Phase I (Low Risk Small Group):

- All Phase 0 Operations
- CAPF 5/91 Requalification
- 1:1 Aircrew Training (MAX CREW of 2) MP & AP Priority
- Air Defense Activities (Fertile Keynote)
- A-12, B-12, and C-12 Proficiency

OPERATIONS

Flight Operations:

COVID-19 Phase 1 means we can conduct limited flight training; the priority for scheduling remains Form 5 and Form 91 recertification flights, mission pilot (MP) and airborne photographer (AP) training, then all other training. At this time the crew should be limited to two persons.

All transport and mission pilots are cleared and encouraged to conduct their Form 5. Funding expires at the end of September. Check in with timothy.coolidge@scwgcap.org for details.

EMERGENCY SERVICES

ICS-300 Virtual Course:

Persons interested in completing an ICS-300 course virtually please notify Lt Col Peterson, South Carolina Wing Vice Commander – Operations, ASAP.

ICS-300, Intermediate ICS for Expanding Incidents, is one of the best courses you can take for mission management. It provides training and resources for personnel who require advanced knowledge and application of the Incident Command System. This course expands upon information covered in the ICS-100 and ICS-200 courses. ICS-300 is a requirement to serve as branch director on a CAP mission, either ground or air. It is also required for completing several other mission staff positions (operations section chief, planning section chief, logistics section chief, finance/administration section chief, CUL etc.) as well as the senior level in some specialty tracks (MRO, PAO etc.).

The course will be held on line in October. That is about the extent of the details that are currently available. Exact dates will be announced once they have been established.

ES Virtual Academy:

LAST CALL for any students! Captain Erick Nason will run another session of the ES Virtual Academy starting this Saturday, 5 September. However, you have until Friday, September 4, to let Capt Nason know.

This version of the ES Virtual Academy will be open to Ground Team 3 (GTM3), Ground Team 2 (GTM2) and Ground Team 1 (GTM1) as well as Ground Team Leader (GTL). For GTLs, Capt Nason will check to see if you need any of the GTM3 tasks that may have expired and need to be redone. Make sure you have met all the prerequisite requirements to take the training (Commander's approval, GES, IS 100 and IS 700).

This is open to the South Carolina Wing, whether you are new or need to renew some tasks. Capt Nason will need your name, CAPID and a good email address; send information to erick.nason@scwqcap.org , erick.nason.ctr@afcent.af.mil or ericknason@msn.com.

If you just want to take the basic wilderness first aid, that is also open, but he needs to know by Friday, Sept. 4 *at the latest*.

The schedule of training is as follows:

- 5 SEPT: 0900 – 1200 GTM 3 tasks/1400-1630 GTM 2/GTL/UDF tasks
- 6 SEPT: 1400 – 1630 GTM 1/GTL Tasks
- 12 SEPT: 0900 – 1100 GTM 3 tasks/1400-1600 GTM 2/GTL/UDF Tasks
- 13 SEPT: 1400 – 1600 UDF/GTL Tasks
- 19 SEPT: 0900 – 1200 GTM 3/1/GTL Tasks/1400-1600 GTM 2/GTL Tasks
- 26 SEPT: 0900 – 1700 First Aid/Basic Wilderness First Aid (BWFA)

This class will incorporate a virtual line search to work on specific line skills. For the first aid portion, the course will use the NASAR Basic Wilderness First Aid class. If you are interested and would like to get a card, a certificate and a patch, the course will require you to purchase the text book and the course. The BWFA cost is \$25 for the course and certificate, and the textbook is about \$25 – \$30. (It is not mandatory to pay for the course; you can still participate without paying the course fee but you won't receive the certificate and patch.)

Depending on when the wing may enter Phase I, Capt Nason will start looking at running ground exercises for small groups to complete the training.

These applications are reviewed by members of the Technical Advisory Group (TAG) and passed to NHQ for use by all CAP members. The best applications come from actual users identifying a need and creating a

Since a conference is a prerequisite to advancement in IT, this is an opportunity to attend a conference and check that box needed for advancement without traveling or paying the cost for a conference.
